Started her career on the London stage at age twelve. She served in the W.R.N.S. in World War II; re-appearing on the London stage in June 1946.

She visited Kenya for the first time in 1952 to appear at her parents' Studio Theatre in "Bell, Book and Candle". The Maules subsequently took this play on tour in Kenya, Uganda and Tanganyika - a Fit-up tour playing twelve venues - January to March 1953 when Annabel returned to London to resume her career there.

In June 1958 the new DONOVAN MAULE THEATRE opened and Annabel returned to Kenya to play a variety of roles through 1962 to 1964. She also took on the management of the theatre during her parents' absence on leave. She returned to London once more but was back in Kenya at the end of 1968 to assume control of the DONOVAN MAULE THEATRE, being appointed Artistic Director followed by Managing Director in 1971 and Chairman in 1973. She sold the theatre in 1979.

In Britain she has made many television appearances and worked frequently for the B.B.C. fulfilling a contract with the Drama Repertory Company in 1954 - 56.

She was awarded the MBE in the Birthday Honours in 1975.

Possibly her most memorable performance in Kenya was that of Queen Mary in "Crown Matrimonial" at the D.M. in 1975 and again at the National Theatre in 1980 in a Nairobi City Players production. She appeared in the film "Out of Africa", playing Lady Byrne.
